Subject: Use Tables

In the past, the Use tables in the CIR reports were based on the categories used in the Voluntary Cosmetic Registration Program (VCRP). However, with the advent of MoCRA, there have been changes, updates, and additions to the product categories. Accordingly, CIR has updated the Use table template (see *UseTableTemplate_UseTables_032026*), as you likely noticed in the March reports. **We are asking for Panel input as to whether the updated table meets the needs of the Panel as you perform your review.**

Specifically:

- Do the Duration and Exposure types that are summarized in the top portion of the table capture the durations and exposures that aid the Panel in their review of safety?
 - Are there any that should be deleted, or should be added?
- Is it the preference of the Panel to see all the values that are reported by product category (i.e., the “raw” data) as given in the bottom portion of the table, or is the top summary portion of the table all that is needed?
 - Please note, as has been done in the past, product categories not applicable to any of the named ingredients in the report (i.e., none of the ingredient(s) have a reported frequency of use for that specific product category) are deleted from the table for clarity
 - If only the summary data are needed, the concentrations of use survey data will still be provided when they are submitted, as is currently done.

You may notice that the total number of uses listed in the RLD does not match the sum of uses listed by duration of use or that of use by exposure type. The reason for this is because ingredients may be used in cosmetic formulations that are reported under more than one product category.

So that it is transparent as to what is captured in the summary of Duration of Use and by Exposure Type, the methodology used is included for your review (*Duration&ExposureBreakouts_UseTables_032026*). Also included are the MoCRA Cosmetic Product Categories and Codes from the FDA website (*MoCRA ProductCategories&Codes_UseTables_032026*; <https://www.fda.gov/cosmetics/registration-listing-cosmetic-product-facilities-and-products/cosmetic-product-categories-and-codes>). **Please review the duration and exposures breakout categories document and be prepared to discuss whether any changes need to be made.** Once the table template is finalized and the categorization methods are agreed upon, this information will be posted on the CIR website.

Additionally, the CIR Science and Support Committee has had the opportunity to review an August 2025 draft of the categorization document, and their comments are included herein (*CIRSSCcomments_UseTables_032026*). Our response to their comments are included for your consideration on page 2 of this memo. **Preferences of the Panel are requested for some comments.**

<p><u>Disposable Wipes</u> The new category, Disposable Wipes is listed under both leave-on and rinse-off exposure. As FDA and the PCPC concentration of use surveys do not distinguish between leave-on and rinse-off exposure for this product category, please only include Disposable Wipes under leave-on exposure.</p> <p>We also note that Disposable Wipes are listed under mucous membrane exposure. As not all Disposable Wipes result in mucous membrane exposure, in responses to PCPC's concentration of use survey, we may provide additional information for this category, e.g., hand wipes, to clarify that the wipe does not result in mucous membrane exposure.</p>	<p>That change has been made.</p> <p>That will be useful.</p> <p>For now, would the Panel like for the disposable wipe uses to default to mucous membrane exposures unless told otherwise? Or should we create a 'possible mucous membrane' exposure category, similar to what is done for possible sprays and powders?</p>
<p><u>Shaving Cream</u> We note that 13E Shaving cream has been placed in the Possible Sprays category. Although shaving creams may be aerosols, they do not result in significant inhalation exposure.</p> <p>The original FDA shaving cream cosmetic product category also included the word aerosol, but this product category was not included in the Possible Spray category in earlier CIR reports. Therefore, to be consistent, please remove 13E Shaving cream from the Possible Sprays category.</p>	<p>What is the preference of the Panel?</p> <p>If the Panel agrees that aerosol shaving creams do not result in significant inhalation, please consider whether possible spray be kept as an exposure if the ingredient is reported to function as a propellant/solvent in that it could result in incidental exposure when functioning in such manner.</p>
<p><u>Possible Sprays Category compared to Possible Sprays & Possible Powders Category</u> We do not understand why the rinse-off Other Hair Preparations, Other Hair Coloring Preparations, Feminine Deodorants, Face & Neck, and Body & Hand products are in the Possible Spray category, while the leave-on versions of these categories are in the Possible Spray & Possible Powder Category. We think putting them all in Possible Sprays & Possible Powders would be sufficient.</p>	<p>It did not seem likely that a powder would be rinsed off, which is the reason for the difference.</p> <p>What is the preference of the Panel?</p>

SUBJECT: Duration and Exposure Breakouts using MoCRA Cosmetic Product Categories

The CIR Science and Support Committee of the Personal Care Products Council appreciates the opportunity to review the proposed Duration and Exposure Breakouts using MoCRA Cosmetic Product Categories (August 2025 draft). We respectfully submit the following comments.

Disposable Wipes

The new category, Disposable Wipes is listed under both leave-on and rinse-off exposure. As FDA and the PCPC concentration of use surveys do not distinguish between leave-on and rinse-off exposure for this product category, please only include Disposable Wipes under leave-on exposure.

We also note that Disposable Wipes are listed under mucous membrane exposure. As not all Disposable Wipes result in mucous membrane exposure, in responses to PCPC's concentration of use survey, we may provide additional information for this category, e.g., hand wipes, to clarify that the wipe does not result in mucous membrane exposure.

Shaving Cream

We note that 13E Shaving cream has been placed in the Possible Sprays category. Although shaving creams may be aerosols, they do not result in significant inhalation exposure.

The original FDA shaving cream cosmetic product category also included the word aerosol, but this product category was not included in the Possible Spray category in earlier CIR reports. Therefore, to be consistent, please remove 13E Shaving cream from the Possible Sprays category.

Possible Sprays Category compared to Possible Sprays & Possible Powders Category

We do not understand why the rinse-off Other Hair Preparations, Other Hair Coloring Preparations, Feminine Deodorants, Face & Neck, and Body & Hand products are in the Possible Spray category, while the leave-on versions of these categories are in the Possible Spray & Possible Powder Category. We think putting them all in Possible Sprays & Possible Powders would be sufficient.
